With Japan at last open for travel after the pandemic, ask to see our new 11 day tour starting in Kyoto, city of temples and geishas where you hike the Philosophers' Path then head to the holy mountain of Mt Koya. Here you'll lodge in a temple with the monks and take a spiritual 2km walk in ancient forest past 200,000 tombstones. The trip highlight, will be the Nakahechi Pilgrimage Trail – a three day hike for the committed walker.

» be in the know « Dine with a geisha, visit the Sumo Wrestler stables or ask for tournament tickets, enjoy an exclusive tour of a private Samurai sword collection, visit a tea farm by bicycle or sample Sake with our local expert.



Your camper can go anywhere and your personal chef and concierge will meet you at the end of an incredible day of touring. Visit a subaquatic cave, 4WD to Thunupa Crater at 4,600m with a fantastic view of the Salt Pans or cycle to Cajchi Island with its giant cacti. Nights are spent stargazing with a hot toddy to keep out the cold.

» be in the know « Travel during the rainy season (November – March) and you can experience the incredible mirror effect of the Salt Pans with water on them. Combine Uyuni with the floating reedbeds of Lake Titicaca and mystical markets of La Paz.



Travel with the locals




Summer Solstice


